BookFlix is an online literacy resource that pairs fictional video storybooks with related nonfiction ebooks. There are 200+ pairs available, including select titles in Spanish. Use this quick guide to get started with the program today!



Getting Started

Log into BookFlix using the credentials provided by your school or library. Both educators and students will have access.





Search

Search by title or select a theme. To find books that are available in both English and Spanish, filter for Spanish by using the toggle or look for the "ES" banner on the pair.





Watch the Story

View an animated children's storybook from Weston Woods. A closed-captioning option is available. Use the Read-Along option to display the audio portion of the story, with word-by-word highlighting as it plays.





Read the Book

View the related nonfiction text presented in an ebook format. You can activate the Read-Along option to hear the text read aloud with word-by-word highlighting. You can also slow down the pace for students who need extra time for comprehension. Click on the yellow-highlighted key content vocabulary words to hear pronunciations and definitions.

Under the Puzzlers! header in the left navigation section, you will find interactive and educational games related to the specific pair.
